WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

This product is a share of an investment company qualifying as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (ICAV).

This product has no maturity date. However, the Board of Directors may decide to close the product under certain circumstances.

The investment objective of the Fund is to achieve capital growth over 5 years, investing globally in the shares of companies that provide solutions to sustainability challenges and falling within certain sustainable investment themes.

Policy:

- The Fund will invest its assets in shares in companies anywhere in the world identified by the investment manager as providing solutions to sustainability challenges. There is no predetermined focus on business sector or geography although concentrations may emerge through stock selection.
- Under normal circumstances, the Fund will hold cash on deposit up to 10% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund. The Fund may also invest in:
 - other transferable securities (such as shares, debentures, government and public securities and warrants), collective investment funds, money market instruments and near cash (which are non-cash assets that are highly liquid and easily converted to cash, such as savings accounts, certificates of deposit and treasury bills).
- The Fund may use financial derivative instruments (contracts where the value is linked to the expected future price movements of an underlying asset) for efficient portfolio management (to reduce costs and/or the overall risk of the Fund). This is in order to reduce the Fund's exposure to risk.
- The Fund will invest in companies that satisfy certain sustainable, environmental, social and Governance criteria ("ESG").
- For the purpose of providing comparable indicative returns only, investors should refer to the MSCI World Net Total Return (USD) Index (the "Index"), which is used by the Investment Manager as a comparator benchmark.
- The Sub-Fund launched on 4 December 2020. The Share Class launched on 4 December 2020.
- The currency of the Fund is USD, the currency of this product is CHF.
- Distribution Policy: If you hold accumulation shares, income from investments in the Fund will be rolled up into the capital assets of the Fund.

The Company is offered to investors who may have basic or no knowledge and experience of investing in financial markets and also experienced investors and is intended for long-term investment. Investors should understand the risks involved, including the risk of losing all capital invested and must evaluate the Company's objective and risks in terms of whether they are consistent with their own investment goals and risk tolerances.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

Cost over time

The tables below show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return).
- For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- 10,000 CHF is invested.
